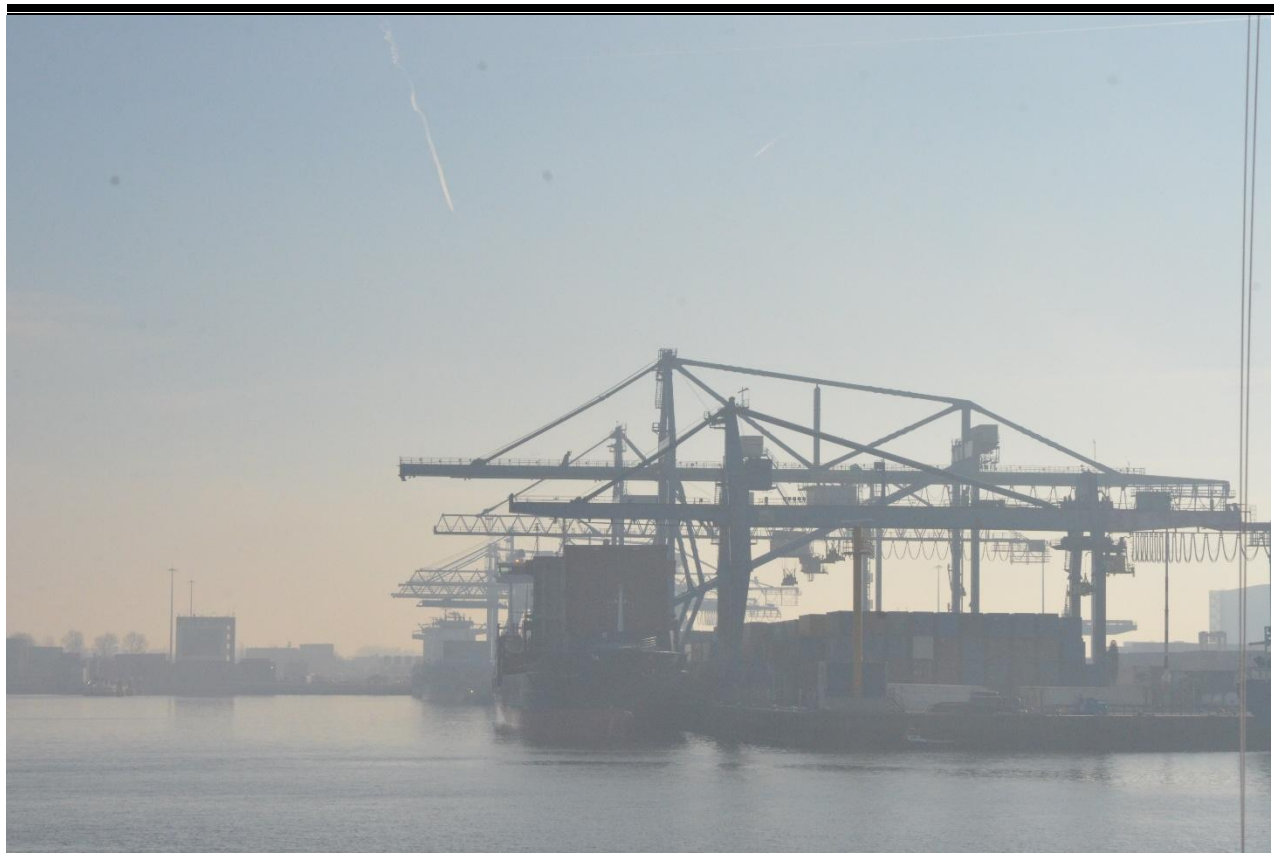
Evening news at Horizon Cruise

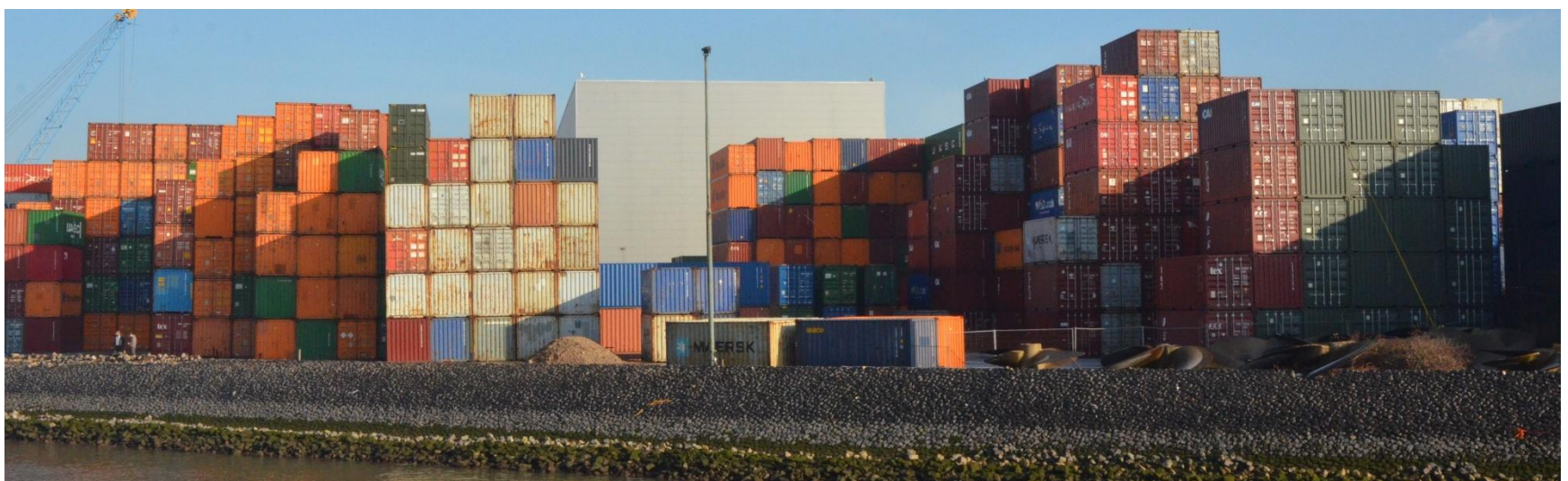
How about a morning cruise

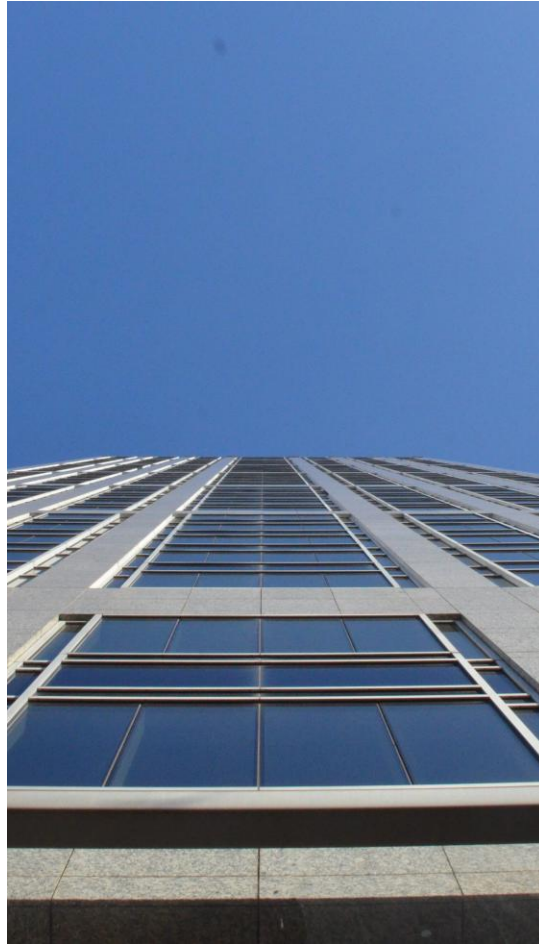
How are the committees doing?

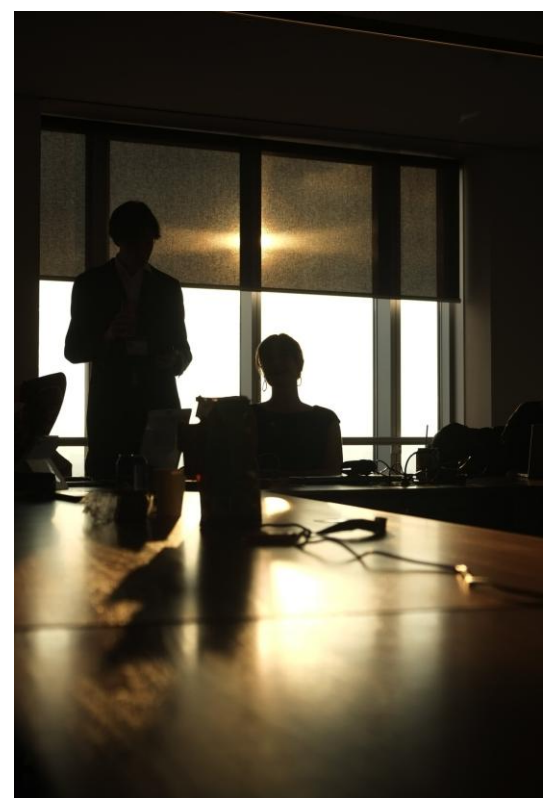
